

This form is to be used by persons (not pyrotechnicians) to apply for a Type 2 fireworks display permit for the celebration of 'Commonwealth Day' (Cracker Night) on 25 May 2024. Applicants must be at least 18 years old. Applications must be submitted at a Service Tasmania Shop, no later than **3 May 2024** with the prescribed fee of \$89.00 and photo ID is required. The application fee is non-refundable.

Cracker night cannot be rescheduled. This means that this permit application is for the date and time noted and cannot be changed.

A fireworks permit may not be granted where the proposed display site is:

- o located in Acton Park, Allens Rivulet, Carlton, Devon Hills, Dodges Ferry, Orielton, Roches Beach, Spreyton or Sandford
- within 500 metres from privately owned horses due to the risk to safety of the horses or persons controlling them unless property occupiers are aware of and agreeable to the display being held
- o within 1 kilometre of a commercial boarding kennel or commercial horse business
- o within 3 kilometres of a sanctuary or conservation area, such as Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary, Tasmania Zoo, and Trowunna Wildlife Park

## PLEASE NOTE: BY SIGNING THE DECLARATION THE APPLICANT ACKNOWLEDGES THAT PERMIT CONDITIONS ARE MANDATORY AND FINES OF UP TO \$9050 MAY APPLY FOR ANY INFRINGEMENT

A fireworks display permit may be refused if:

- The proposed fireworks display cannot be conducted without the likelihood of causing serious harm to the environment or material harm to the environment as defined by the *Explosives Act 2012*
- The proposed fireworks display cannot be safely organised and held
- Multiple applications for the same address or area have been made
- Information provided within this or previous applications is false or misleading
- The applicant is not considered to be a fit and proper person to hold a fireworks display

Depending on the location of the display, additional notification requirements may apply:

- If the proposed site for the display is within one kilometre of any property that is used for commercial livestock operations, you must give notice to the owner or occupier of such property
- If the proposed site is within one kilometre of any reserved land within the meaning of the *Nature Conservation Act 2002*, you must give notice to the Director of National Parks and Wildlife
- If the proposed site is within one kilometre of a permanent timber production zone land, within the meaning of the *Forest Management Act 2013*, you must give notice to Forestry Tasmania.
- If the proposed site is on the seashore and the display will involve any aerial display of fireworks, you must give notice to Marine and Safety Tasmania
